This money continues to fund field trips, teacher spending accounts, school wide events (such as fun day or Hip Hop with Nii), and as of the last PAC meeting, we have consensus to furnish sensory rooms at the school and purchase more computers for all students to access.

Highlights of this year included the return of the hot lunch program, track and field, the purchase of additional PE equipment, and the incredible carnival.

### **ULEPAC Fundraising**

PAC activities and spending in this year were funded by a Gaming Grant from the BC Government (\$10,140) and PAC fundraising activities (\$47,156). In addition, the PAC social events (movie night and parent social) also generated income (\$4,046).

Hot Lunch (\$19,865), Silent Auction (\$15,002) and Carnival (\$7,225) were the biggest fundraisers.

Our fundraisers benefit our children in many ways. Thank you for your ongoing support!

### **PAC Budget**

The PACs fundraising and spending is governed by the annual PAC budget. The PAC budget is drafted with input from PAC executive and volunteers, teachers, school administration and parents.

The 2022-2023 budget was presented at the June 2022 AGM and approved by majority vote.

### **Fundraising Spending**

The following are some of the major items that PAC funds were spent on during the year:

**\$9,627 for Divisional expenses**: an amount of \$500 per division is made available to teachers to reimburse any expenses that they may have related to teaching in the classroom and that is not covered by the School or School District. Typical purchases include classroom supplies, arts and craft materials, books, class prizes, materials for science experiments and teaching aids.

#### **\$7,000 for Tennis lessons**: each division received 5 lessons.

Skills taught for primary students include hand-eye coordination, reception and projection skills, catching/throwing/bounce/hit/balance and proper use of racquet and ball.

Skills taught for intermediate students include advancing above skills, more game experiences, backhand bumps, body positioning, rallying skills, foreheads, backhands, volleys and serves.

**\$4,645 for Cultural Performances**: The exposure to performing arts for children is well documented and the PAC funded several performances:

- The Abbey Road Rockers (Sept 27, 2022) introduced the music of the Beatles.
- The Black Dog String Quartet (January 9, 2023) exposed students to the music of Mozart, Pachelbel, Beethoven. Vivaldi, Bach, and Mozart.
- Rain City Improv (May 1, 2023) offered an interactive, student-centered improv experience.
- Axe Capoeira on May 30, 2023 (two performances on Fun Day) exposed students to a combination of dance, acrobatics, music, and theatrics.

**\$2,760** for First Aid Training: First Aid is a vital life skill and each year the PAC funds first aid training for all Grade 6 students. This year, training was also funded for Grade 7 students that missed out last year when training could not take place due to COVID restrictions.



**\$1,575** for Sexual Health Education: the PAC funded Saleema Noon Sexual Health Educators' Body Science program at Upper Lynn. The program included a parent workshop and age-appropriate workshops for students from Kindergarten to Grade 7.

**\$5,948** for Field Trip transportation: the PAC makes \$400 per division available to help cover the cost of field trip transportation. It is up to each teacher to decide which field trips they want to undertake with their students. This year the PAC helped to fund field trips to the following destinations:

- Cypress Tube Park
- Playland
- Britannia Mine Museum
- Science World
- Mount Seymour
- Laity Pumpkin Patch in Maple Ridge
- Presentation House
- Intermediate Music Festival

**\$1,376 for Online Education**: the PAC covered the cost of classroom subscriptions to IXL Math for those teachers that requested it. Teachers found it greatly useful to reinforce and extend their teaching.

**\$2,470 for Library books:** the PAC funds the purchases of library books in addition to the funding that the library receives from School District funds.

**\$1,800** for Hip-Hop Lessons: Each class received 2 sessions. Lessons included the fundamentals of hip hop and incorporating that into a group routing. This was a very popular program and the PAC received requests to increase the number of lessons in future.

**\$1,999 for PE Equipment:** The PAC funded 50% of the cost of a new high jump mat, as well as the cost of rugby balls and cones.

**\$3,269** for Primary Requests: This included Natura Pod Play arch for creative open-ended play, classroom carpets, focus screens and magnatiles. Also included were the Duckling Educational Hatching program: students have the opportunity to learn about the life cycle – watch a fertile egg develop, hatch, grow and change, right through the first few weeks.

\$866 for Technology: including speakers, school entrance display monitor and computer.

**\$444** for Earthquake Supplies: gradually replacing current water in our emergency supplies with 50-year shelf-life blue can water. This is a multi-year process.

**\$269 for Music expenses:** the PAC funded the purchase of Xylophone mallets.

The PAC also spend on the following special projects:

**\$9,645 for Accessible Playground project**: The equipment was installed in September 2022.



**\$8,381** for Sensory Room/Self-Regulation project: Equipment was procured in line with the proposal approved by members at the June 2022 AGM. The project was not yet completed and at the June 2023 AGM members approved that remaining \$6,000 not spent in the 2022-2023 year, can be made available in the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

**\$250 for Mural of School Logo in the Gym**: The project could not be completed and the \$250 deposit paid to the artist has been forfeited.
